"Visitation" and "The Promise," two sculptures by David Keevil which make up his installation titled "Tent Message," will be exhibited in Mandeville East Room on the University of California, San Diego campus beginning 9 a.m. Friday, January 7.

"Tent Message" contains a mixture of images and objects that refer to stage props, carnival booths, religious and personal imagery.

"Each piece has a specific action for the viewer to do," stated Keevil, "which allows the viewer to participate in a personal 'religious event."

David Keevil is a first-year graduate student in the Department of Visual Arts at UCSD. He studied at Amherst College and The Rhode Island School of Design, where he received his B.F.A. in sculpture.

This installation will be on display through Friday, January 14. Mandeville East Room, located off the lobby of Mandeville Center Auditorium, will be open 9 a.m. to 4 p.m. Monday through Friday. The exhibit will be closed through the weekend of January 8-9.
