"SHAPING THE CITY" SYMPOSIUM HELD MAY 5 AT UCSD

Planning issues that affect people and the cities in which they live were discussed at a daylong symposium sponsored by the School of Architecture at the University of California, San Diego, May 5.

Societal changes in both individual housing and the broader urban environment received comment from the four featured panelists and eight San Diego participants in the symposium.

A capacity audience of 800 attended the event in Mandeville Center Auditorium.

Featured panelists were nationally known architects Barton Myers of Los Angeles, Stanton Eckstut of New York, Daniel Solomon of San Francisco and developer James Rouse of Maryland.

San Diegans participating in the discussions were Pam Hamilton of the Centre City Development Corp., architect Ralph Roesling, landscape architect Ignacio Bunster, City Councilman Ron Roberts, developers Ernest Hahn and Tawfiq Khoury, architect Don Hansen and San Diego City Architect Michael Stepner.

Richard Bender of San Francisco, former dean of the College of Environmental Design at UC Berkeley, served as moderator. Commentary was added by Adele Naude Santos, professor of architecture and urban design at the University of Pennsylvania who recently accepted appointment--now pending Board of Regents' approval--as the first dean of UCSD's School of Architecture.

In conjunction with the symposium, an exhibition featuring projects of the four speakers is being held at Mandeville Gallery at UCSD through May 13.
