

## **Medieval Christmas music presented by Student Committee for the Return of Aristocratic Monarchy (SCRAM)**

**November 30, 1966**

A program of Medieval Christmas music and dance will be presented 8:00 p.m., Tuesday, December 6, by the Mesa College Madrigal Singers and Recorder Consort, at the University of California, San Diego. The concert, which is free and open to the public, will be in room 2722, Undergraduate Sciences Building.

David McNair, a faculty member at Mesa College and a composer and specialist in early music, will lead the group in Medieval English Christmas carols sung in Middle English. He is the former Director of the Old Globe Consort.

Dr. David Crowne of the Department of Literature at UCSD will read the texts of the songs, and the McNair dancing group will add to the medieval setting by performing medieval festival dances.

Elizabeth Hamilton Manchester, currently on the music faculty of Mesa College and UCLA extension, will play medieval keyboard music and several harpsichord compositions from the reign of Henry VIII, as well as a piece written by Henry VIII.

Mrs. Manchester, formerly on the piano staff at UCLA, has performed with the Huntington Park Symphony and is a member of the Clements Pro Musica Consort.
