

Chamber Singers from UCSB to appear at UCSD

The Chamber Singers, a group of 16 specially trained solo singers from the University of California, Santa Barbara will sing on the University's San Diego campus at 8:00 p.m. Monday, January 29, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium. The concert is free and open to the public.

The highly trained group was first organized in 1958 to master a specialized vocal repertoire of Renaissance, Baroque and old Spanish literature. The current repertoire of the group includes the Flemish and English Madrigal School, Spanish-American, German, French and Italian music, plus a large number of contemporary works.

The Chamber Singers, founded and directed by Dorothy Westra, appear on the UCSD campus as part of the Intercampus Cultural Exchange Program. They are sponsored by the UCSD Committee for Arts and Lectures.
