

UCSD economist receives Guggenheim Fellowship

Vincent Crawford, a professor of economics at the University of California, San Diego, has been granted a Fellowship from the John Simon Guggenheim Memorial Foundation. Crawford, chair of the UCSD Economics Department and a well known economic theorist, was one of 164 artists, scholars, and scientists selected from among 2,876 applicants for Fellowship awards totaling \$4,890,000.

Crawford, who has received numerous awards and honors for his many accomplishments and research activities in the fields of microeconomics and game theory, has been a professor at UCSD since 1976 and chair of the department of economics since 1994. According to Crawford, the Guggenheim Fellowship will support his current research on experimental studies of strategic behavior and cognition.

Guggenheim Fellows are appointed on the basis of unusually distinguished achievement in the past and exceptional promise for future accomplishment. During its 73 year history, the Foundation has granted nearly \$176 million in Fellowships.
