William Van Alstyne lecture at Sherwood Hall

William Van Alstyne, Professor of Law at Ohio State University, is scheduled to open the 1964-65 University of California, San Diego, Guest Lecture Series at 8:00 p.m. Thursday, August 6, in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla Museum of Art.

Mr. Van Alstyne, who has dealt intensively with constitutional law and civil rights issues, will talk on "The Warren Court and the Constitution."

He is currently serving as a Visiting Professor of Law at Duke University and the University of California, Los Angeles, and this fall will serve as a Senior Fellow in the Yale Law School.

Mr. Van Alstyne graduated Magna Cum Laude from the University of Southern California in 1955 with a degree in philosophy. During his senior year he was named Western States Debate champion. He received a Bachelor of Laws from Stanford University in 1958 and a Certificate from the Hague Academy of International Law in 1961. He served as Deputy Attorney General in the California Department of Justice in 1958 and as an attorney in the Civil Rights Division of the United States Department of Justice a year later.

He served as adviser to the Ohio Civil Rights Commission during 1960-61 in which capacity he drafted the amended Ohio Public Accommodations Act which was adopted in 1961.
