

## **Conference on "The Spanish Republic on its 50th Anniversary: An Evaluation of the Experience" sponsored by Graduate Studies and Research**

A conference on "The Spanish Republic on its 50th Anniversary: An Evaluation of the Experience" is scheduled Friday and Saturday, April 17 and 18, at the University of California, San Diego.

The conference opens Friday with a series of lectures sponsored by the Office of Graduate Studies and Research in room 3030A of the Undergraduate Sciences Building on Revelle campus.

At 2:30 p.m., Victor Fuentes of UC Santa Barbara will discuss "Social Literature of the 1920s and 1930s." At 3:30 p.m., Edward Hymen of the University of San Francisco will discuss "Psycho-History: Uses and Misuses." A graduate student and faculty colloquium will be conducted from 4:30 to 5:30 p.m. A film called "The Spanish Earth," with narration by Ernest Hemingway, will be shown at 8 p.m. in room 2722 of the Undergraduate Sciences Building.

The Department of History and the Center for Iberian and Latin American Studies are sponsoring the Saturday conference in Conference Room 111A of the Administrative Complex.

Registration is at 9 a.m. and lectures scheduled for the all-day conference include "The Trial for Royal Responsibilities in 1931," "Marxist Revolutionary Efforts During the Republic" and "Images of the Spanish Republic." Lunch will be served at 12:30 p.m. and a wine and cheese reception is scheduled at 5:30 p.m.

The Veterans of the Abraham Lincoln Brigade are sponsoring a showing of the film "Dreams and Nightmares" at 8 p.m. in room 2722 of the Undergraduate Sciences Building. Former Congressman John T. Bernard will participate in a discussion following the film.

The registration fee is \$5 for the general public and faculty, \$1 for students with student identification and free for senior citizens. The fee includes the Saturday lunch and wine and cheese.
