

## Seminar on American federalism and intergovernmental relations taught by Harry N. Scheiber of the School of Law at UC Berkeley

## March 16, 1981

Public administrators are invited to enroll in a four-week seminar at the University of California, San Diego to examine American federalism and intergovernmental relations.

The seminar, "Federalism in Perspective: Constitutional Ideals and Modern Governmental Practice," runs from June 28 until July 26 and will be taught by Professor Harry N. Scheiber of the School of Law at the University of California, Berkeley.

Seminar participants will consider the role that governments--state, local and federal--have played in shaping American society. At focus will be the political and constitutional values which, historically, have impelled change, reform and innovation.

Housing for participants and their families will be available on the campus.

The National Endowment for the Humanities, which is sponsoring the seminar, has made available 14 fellowships of \$1,200 each for which applicants may compete. The final date for application is April 13, 1981.
