

Artfest '83, event featuring the art works of UCSD students to open

Artfest '83, a multi-media event featuring the art works of students at the University of California, San Diego, will open at 12 noon on Monday, January 17, in the Mandeville Annex Gallery on the UCSD campus.

This exhibition includes multi-media works by Gregory Redmond, Marjorie Mowry and other UCSD students, as well as showings of classic comedy films and poetry readings.

Artfest '83 will end in a reception at 6 p.m. Friday, January 21 in the Mandeville Annex Gallery. The art works will be judged by a student panel, and prizes will be awarded. Certain art works will be auctioned to benefit the Nazareth House Orphanage in San Diego. Clowns, jugglers and a magician will perform at the reception.

Classic film shorts by Charlie Chaplin, Laurel and Hardy and The Three Stooges, as well as cartoons by Tex Avery, will be screened every evening of Artfest '83 at 6 p.m. in the gallery.

Gallery attendees will be invited to participate in making their own art works during the exhibition.

Artfest '83 will be open from 12 noon to 7 p.m. Monday through Friday. There is no admission charge.
