UCSD CHANCELLOR'S ASSOCIATES HONOR FACULTY MEMBERS

Three University of California, San Diego faculty members were honored for excellence in research, teaching and community service by the Chancellor's Associates at a recent meeting in the Faculty Club.

The honorees included Cecil W. Lytle, professor of music and provost of Thurgood Marshall College, cited for Outstanding Community Service; Marilyn G. Farquhar, professor of pathology, Excellence in Research, and Mark Machina, professor of economics, Excellence in Teaching.

Lytle was honored for sharing his extraordinary musical talents with the San Diego community through lectures and performances at elementary schools, community centers and parks, youth music groups, television and radio. His proposal to establish the UCSD charter school prompted widespread discussions on the university's outreach programs.

Farquhar, the world's foremost authority on the transport of substances across cell membranes, was honored for laying the foundation for modern understanding of membrane disorders in humans.

Machina was cited for his enormous passion for teaching, careful presentations, and dramatically entertaining style in drawing students to the field of economics.
