

## Chancellors of two University of California campuses will speak at a dinner meeting in San Diego May 18

Chancellors of two University of California campuses-- Berkeley and San Diego-- will speak at a dinner meeting in San Diego Friday evening, May 18.

The event is sponsored by the California Alumni Club of San Diego County. It will be held at the San Diego Athletic Club, 1250 Sixth Avenue, at 7:30 p.m.

Featured speakers will be Chancellor Edward W. Strong, recently inaugurated Chancellor of the Berkeley campus, Chancellor Herbert York, San Diego, and Richard E. Erickson, Executive Manager of the California Alumni Association.

Chancellor Strong will speak on "Looking to the Future in Berkeley." Chancellor York will discuss future plans for the University's general campus at San Diego.

"Persons interested in the future of the University are welcome to attend," says Richard Johnston, President of the County Alumni Club. Fee for the dinner is \$3.90 per person. A Professor of Philosophy on the Berkeley faculty, Dr. Strong served as laboratory manager of the Radiation Laboratory, Chairman of the Department of Sociology and Social Institutions, Associate Dean of the College of Letters and Science, and Vice-Chancellor in charge of academic affairs before he succeeded Glenn T. Seaborg as Chancellor in July 1961. His talk in San Diego will include reflections on the physical development, enrollment, curriculum and new departments, such as nuclear engineering, at the Berkeley campus.

Immediately after his address, Chancellor Strong flies to Washington, D. C. at the invitation of Vice President Lyndon Johnson, to participate in an educational conference.

President Clark Kerr of the University, originally scheduled as a speaker at the banquet, will be unable to appear because President Kennedy has requested that the President's Labor-Management Advisory Committee, of which President Kerr is Chairman, be convened.
