Among outstanding landmarks you will note the gun-tinted adobe (now a book and gift shop) which was one of the early courts in California; the home of Governor Juan Bautista Alvarado, a residence built about 1836, above where Colton Hall now stands; and the houses bearing the names of the Amesti, Abrego, Escolle, Vasquez, Serrano and Soberanes families, though their original owners possess them no more. The old Pacheco adobe is incorporated in a hospital.
