Bernard Sisco, vice chancellor of administration, presented the awards, given annually to several UCSD employees as part of the Employee Awards Through Ideas program. Caro, an electronics technician, received the top award for the development of a combination slide projector and pointer operated by remote control. Powers, an associate architect, was the second winner for a proposal which saves money on the water systems of campus construction projects. A third award was also given to Sally O'Donovan, a former UCSD employee, whose suggestion reduced operating costs of copy machines.
