Dear Sir:

As you know, John W. Clark died at Nushagak some time last December. He had in June, 1895 taken out a policy of accident insurance with The Fidelity & Casualty Co. of New York whereby he was for the period of 12 months insured against bodily injuries resulting in death, in the principal sum of \$5000.00 payable to his daughter Natalia Clark. This policy was at its expiration renewed for the period of one year.

I am informed that Mr. Clark died from injuries received by him a few days before his death. I am not however, in possession of sufficiently detailed information regarding the alleged accident to make formal proofs of death to the Insurance Company; it will be necessary to have the sworn statement of a number of persons before we can make such proofs; and inasmuch as I understand you are about to send some one to Nushagak to settle up Mr. Clark's affairs, I would ask you on behalf of the beneficiary, his daughter, to secure the following data:

1.-The affidavit of an eye-witness to the injury stating in detail the date of the accident, the nature of the injury, the mamer in which it was received and as fully as possible all circums tances attending the matter, which may be within the knowledge of such witness. If there was more than one eye-witness, I would like to have an affidavit of as many of them as can be secured. 2.-The blank proofs issued by the Company provide also for affidavits of the attending Physician, of the Clergyman and of the Sexton, the last two for the purpose of identification; but I presume that in this case no persons answering any of these descriptions were present. Please therefore, have the affidavits of the other parties identify the deceased as John W. Clark of the City and County of San Francisco, State of California, by occupation a fur trader, this being the description of the insured in the policy.

Although there was no attending Physician I understand number a trained attended Mr. Clark during his illness and I should like to have her affidavit giving in the fullest detail possible, the exact nature of his injuries and the cause of death.

I presume the above is about all that we can do in the matter, but I may add generally that I would like to have an affidavit from every one at Nushagak who knows anything whatever about the injury or the resulting illness or death of Mr. Clark, even though such knowledge may not be very minute. We are at such a long distance away from Nushagak and communication is so infrequent that it is well to find out what we can now and so save the

cost and delay of sending up again. I should like also to have an affidavit (which you possibly may be able to furnish) to the effect that there was no mail or other communication between Nushagak and San Francisco or any other point where the Insurance Company could have been notified of the injury from the time of the accident, (some time in November) until about the middle of May.
