The Revolutionary Black Drama Association of the University of California, San Diego will present a program of original poetry, drama, music and African dancing at 8 p.m. Friday, Sept. 14, in Room 2100 of the Basic Science Building, School of Medicine.

Featured performers in the show, called "Life is our Future," will be Tommy Calimee and his group, Walimu, who will dance spontaneously to poetry and music.

Guest artists will include singer Roy Galloway, a member of the Operation Breadbasket Choir in Los Angeles, and Toni and Vicky Butler, of San Diego, who will dance and give poetry readings.

The program, which is free and open to the public, will be produced and directed by Cheryl A. Garrett, group president and a Third College senior.

Other performers in the show will include Patricia Whitlock, Adriana Richards, Gie Simpson, Debra Hall, Sharon Duvernay, Michael Curry, Paula Shetula, Linda Arthur, Talamu, Caspar "Chipper" Glenn and Ms. Garrett.

Some 70 UCSD students are active in the one-year-old association which was founded to further understanding of Black cultural arts.

Recent activities of the group have included participation in the Watts Summer Festival in Los Angeles, and the America's Finest City celebration in San Diego.
