

American Cancer Society awards grants to six researchers at UCSD

The American Cancer Society has awarded grants totaling \$596,076 to the University of California, San Diego and six researchers at the campus.

In addition to a \$25,000 grant to the institution the six researchers who received individual grants were: John N. Abelson, Ph.D., Department of Chemistry, \$125,000; Richard W. Dutton, Ph.D., Center for Developmental Biology, \$119,272; E. Peter Geiduschek, Ph.D., Department of Biology, \$50,000; David R. Kearns, Ph.D., Department of Chemistry, \$84,115; Herbert Stern, Ph.D., Center for Developmental Biology, \$112,203, and Michael G. Rosenfeld, M.D., School of Medicine, \$80,486.

The UC San Diego researchers were among 49 in California who were awarded cancer research grants totaling \$4,305,550 this year.

The \$25,000 institutional grant is awarded to encourage "scientists or physicians who want to try out a new idea, develop a tangential idea to their main line of endeavor, take the wrinkles out of a new technique, engage in research on a part time basis, or stimulate a student to try his or her hand at research," according to the ACS.
