Chicano's Stage Demonstration at Border

Protest Proposal to Build Fences Between U.S. and Mexico

SAN YSIDRO—Nearly 1,000 Chicano demonstrators marched peacefully through this small border community Sunday in an attempt to send a message to President Carter and Mexican President Jose Lopez Portillo.

"No fence. No fence. No fence," the protesters chanted in both English and Spanish as they slowly walked the four-mile route that took them within a stone's throw of the international border and directly in front of U.S. Immigration offices.

A main point of contention was the proposed construction of a six-mile, \$3.5 million fence in San Ysidro and El Paso, Tex.

Herman Baca, a Committee on Chicano Rights, Inc. spokesman from National City, told a rally that the proposed fence between Mexico and the United States is an insult to Spanish-speaking peoples on both sides of the border.

"It can only serve as a symbol to all that the immigration policy is one of racism, discrimination and bigotry against 16 million Chicanos and Latinos," Baca said.

"This fence can only serve as a monument to the government's unwillingness and inability to resolve the immigration issue," he said. "Why isn't there a fence between Canada and the United States?"

He told the marchers who came from Mexico, California and other bordering U.S. states that the fence,

Denver Crusade for Justice said the Carter trip to Mexico City had nothing to do with human rights.

"Carter's meeting with Portillo is not on human rights but profits," Gonzales said, referring to discussions of Mexico's proposed sale of oil to the United States.

"Mexico is in danger of being raped again," he added.

Protesters shouted at vehicles going across the border.

which he called "Carter's curtain," was a waste of money.

"It's ridiculous to believe that a six-mile fence along a 2,000-mile border is going to stop anyone or is going to resolve the social, economic and political factors which make up the immigration issue," he concluded.

The march was timed to coincide with Wednesday's scheduled meeting in Mexico City between Carter and Portillo. They are expected to confer about oil and immigration, among other things.

San Diego police cars were evident along the march route Sunday. Officers estimated the crowd at between 800 and 1,000 but officials of the Committee on Chicano Rights, which organized the protest, said the number was much higher, possibly 2,000.

No incidents were reported to police and no arrests were made.

At one point in the march, the group shouted from a pedestrian bridge, only yards from the international crossing between San Ysidro and Tijuana, at motorists crossing the border.

Reporters from Mexico flocked to the demonstration.

Signs carried by the marchers included such slogans as: "The people united will not be defeated," "No barbed wire between brothers," "Carter's curtain is inhumane" and "Stop the fence."

Officials of the Chicano Federation last week rejected a White House invitation to meet with Carter to discuss the issues facing Mexico and the United States.

They instead invited him to march with them Sunday.

The marchers also called for an end to the "Vietnamlike militarization" along the border and alleged violations of human rights by the Border Patrol.

Also, they called for an overhaul of U.S. immigration policy, which they said was "bankrupt" years ago.

"We are gathered here today," said Baca, "in order that a message can be sent from our organizations and our people to both President Jimmy Carter and President Jose Portillo before they meet in Mexico City on the issues of oil and immigration."

Chicanos: Rhetoric or results?

There was lots of hullabaloo at the border Sunday when some 1,500 Chicanos and their sympathizers staged a march to protest the Carter administration's plans to build so-called "Tortilla Curtains" or "Carter Curtains" along the Tijuana and Juarez borders to try to stem the tide of illegal immigrants from Mexico.

Speakers called on the President to pledge in his meetings this week with Mexican President Jose Lopez Portillo that he will not build the proposed 10-foot high, six-mile long fence. Angrily, they pointed out that there is no "curtain" between the U.S. and Canada, that the proposed barrier is an insult to Mexicans.

They called Mr. Carter's proposed partial amnesty plan for illegal aliens inadequate. They charged the President with being insensitive to the feelings of Latins. And they asked him to pledge to Chicano leaders, "as an act of good faith," that he will not build the fence.

UNFORTUNATELY, the Chicano leaders did not give him an opportunity to give such a pledge in person. Nor did they give themselves an opportunity to "sensitize" him.

You see, two days before the demonstration, leaders of the San Diego Chicano Federation and the San Diego Committee on Chicano Rights, sponsors of the protest, rejected an invitation from the White House to meet personally with President Carter to discuss their views with him.

The reason, according to the federation chairman: "We are doubtful that he will seriously consider any input that does not coincide with his present policies."

So, instead of talking with President Carter face to face, the Chicano leaders chose to get their message to the president by shouting at him from 3,000 miles away.

Could it be that they'd rather hear themselves talk than work meaningfully for constructive change? *Let the report of*

MANY AMERICANS — and I'm among them — doubt seriously the wisdom of erecting a "Tortilla Curtain" that, in Latin America, would rival in opprobrium that infamous curtain erected by the Communists (although, in fairness, it should be pointed out that theirs is to keep their own people locked in, while ours would be to keep others out)

Many Americans — including me — also believe that a more humane and constructive solution can be found to the problem of undocumented workers, particularly considering these immigrants play an important role in our economy; otherwise, there would be no demand for their services.

However, people like me, who share many of the Chicanos' goals for a more just and equitable society, find it difficult to sympathize with people who frequently seem more interested in rhetoric than results.

THE REJECTION of the President's personal invitation is the most flagrant example of this. But on a local level, this kind of counterproductive behavior has been going on for a long time.

Few educators, for example, are as personally and gut-level dedicated to equal opportunity in education as Earl Denton, the Sweetwater District superintendent. He lost his last job as superintendent in the Los Angeles area because of it. And yet, by viciously attacking Dr. Denton for sins of his predecessors, the Chicano leadership lost the opportunity to have a good friend and ally.

The Star-News has long championed many of the causes of the Chicanos. It has tried over the years to heal the divisions that set neighbor against neighbor, to encourage redressing the just grievances suffered by Mexican-Americans.

Yet, because this newspaper printed an article criticizing the tactics of one of the leaders, for two years none of these so-called leaders would talk with Star-News reporters, thus losing an opportunity to tell the community as a whole their legitimate point of view.

Similarly, when a National City policeman shot to death a Latin youth, many non-Chicano demanded sweeping reforms in the police department (in fact, this newspaper has been demanding this long before the Chicano leaders).

But public sympathy for the Chicanos' cause vanished when they tried to turn this incident into a recall movement against the City Council and used tactics which, again, turned friends at city hall into enemies.

CHICANOS like those who rejected President Carter's invitation are in danger of becoming leaders without followers and without influence. And this would be a shame, because their cause in most instances is just.

For their sake, for the sake of Mexican-Americans everywhere (whether they choose to call themselves Chicanos or not), and for the sake of our entire society which needs to understand their viewpoint, I hope they

Estimados Companeros de la Prensa,

We are here today to ask you, the members of the Mexican press, to convey to the people of Mexico, a message...a message from the 16 million Chicanos/Latinos of the United States that we no longer will tolerate the continued abuses of our people, los Mexicanos, by the I.N.S. and the U.S. government, whether they live on this or that side of the border. An injustice against one is an injustice against all; to us there is no border. We ask today that the Mexican people join us in stopping the construction of that most odious symbol of racism, discrimination, and bigotry. The "Carter curtain" which is being proposed and to be built along the border of San Ysidro, California, and El Paso, Texas will be such a symbol.

Many people have asked me why we are having a protest march. We are marching because there comes a time when one has to take a stand, a stand for what one believes in, a stand that proclaims that our people's rights for too long have been violated and that we Mexicans also have rights. We declare today before President Carter and President Portillo meet in Mexico City, Que Ya Basta! Hasta Aqui!...No Mas!...And that we are tired. We want our rights respected before any agreements are made in Mexico City and we



will tolerate no more abuses nor will we any longer stand by and see our people mistreated and oppressed whether on this side or that side of the border simply because we are of a different color and culture.

Let us have a clear understanding that the "Carter Curtain" is not just a fence. It is a symbol of racism, of discrimination, of oppression...and of the low esteem that the government of the United States holds of the 16 million Chicanos/Latinos in the United States and of 60 million Mexican citizens. We want to make it clear to you what this fence means to us and exactly what the political reasons are for the construction of such a symbol.

Gentlemen of the Press, the fence is a test. A test of the Chicanos and the Mexican people. Chicanos are the "testing ground" of how far the government dare go in its relations towards Mexico. If we the Chicanos fail to respond or are luke warm to the construction of the fence, then the United States will deal with impunity towards Mexico; because if there is no respect for 16 million Chicanos living within its own borders then how can there be respect for Mexicans living in Mexico. If we the Chicanos and you Los Mexicanos fail to respond to the construction of the proposed fence.. it is a



a clear signal to American policy makers that the United States can proceed without concern with the continued abuse and exploitation of the Chicano in the United States, and the exploitation of Mexico's resources (Undocumented workers and oil) without fear.

We wish to make it clear that La Raza represents a potential 10 million votes within the United States and will have a decisive voice in the most powerful states in the Union. The United States of the 1980's is not the America of 1910. Chicanos are a growing number and we will have a voice. Today we ask the help of the Mexican people. Now more than ever, while your President waits to meet with President Carter we ask that they help us send a strong message..."That Mexico, the United States, Chicanos, and Anglo-Americans must learn to deal with each other with equality and respect. And that the fence not be constructed because it is an insult to every Mexican of the Republic of Mexico and Chicano of the United States".

Today, we ask the people of Mexico to join with us in making a stand by joining with us on February 11, 1979, in San Ysidro in demonstrating our deep concern over the symbol of the fence, in order that all of us together can begin the task of resolving the immigration issue which is now before us. JUSTICE FOR CARLOS MONTES

The Justice for Carlos Montes Committee held a demonstration on Jan. 31, at the Los Angeles Criminal Courts Bldg. Over 60 people attended with representatives from American Indian Movement, Iranian Student Movement, Anti-Bakke Decision Coalition and others. The purpose of the demonstration was to demand freedom for Carlos Montes, Leonard Peltier (A.I.M.) and all political prisoners.

Jan. 31 was set for the start of the trial for Carlos Montes, but the trial was again delayed by the courts and Judge Eli Chernow, who did not rule on a motion to dismiss the charges against Carlos Montes because of the destruction of surveillance files. This motion was made in early December of 1978 and calls for the dismissal of all charges on the grounds that the Los Angeles Police Department destroyed all police surveillance files on Carlos Montes and the Brown Berets. These files are necessary for the defense to show the systematic attempt by the Los Angeles Police Department to infiltrate, disrupt and frame the Brown Berets and Carlos Montes.

February 9, 1979 has been set for a final decision. If the judge grants the motion we win, if he denies our motion then we start trial.

We are calling on all people to start a letter writing campaign to Judge Chernow asking him to dismiss the charges on February 9! We are asking community people, organizations, lawyers and students to write to the judge at:





This letter is to confirm our telephone conversation of January 23, 1979, in which I agreed to furnish you information regarding the National Protest March.



I am writing to you to express my personal sorrow over the fact that you feel you are unable to obtain fair coverage from the Star-News.


I was very much interested in discussing with you reasons for the border protest planned for the weekend of Feb. 14, but was informed by your office that no such conversation could be arranged.

This letter is to advise you that your request for a parade permit for a demonstration march on February 11, 1979, from Larson Park to San Ysidro Boulevard, south on San Ysidro Boulevard to the international border, west across the pedestrian crossing to Camiones Way, north on Camiones Way to Ensenada Street, and return to Larson Park has been denied.



El Sr. Baca añadió que: "Los Chicanos/Latinos aquí en San Diego presentarán un "Frente Unido" tocante a los puntos arriba mencionados para que se le envíe un "Fuerte Mensaje" al Presidente Carter y al Presidente López Portillo quienes se reunirán en la Ciudad de México el 14 de febrero de 1979 para tratar los asuntos del petróleo y la inmigración. La postura de la comunidad Chicana/Latina es la de que "la conferencia de la Ciudad de México" expondrá tratados y tomará decisiones que a fin de cuentas afectará profundamente el destino social, económico, y político de los 16 millones de Chicanos/Latinos aquí en los Estados Unidos y por esta razón se ha hecho el llamado a la Marcha de Protesta Nacional.

On February 7, 1979 President Carter extended an invitation through the Chicano Federation to the San Diego Chicano Community to attend a meeting at the White House on Monday February 12th to discuss his upcoming trip to Mexico City.

After much discussion and deliberation the Board of Directors of the Chicano Federation have authorized the release of the following as a response to Mr. Carter's invitation.

The Federation will not send a representative to the February 12th, 1979 White House meeting because we are doubtful that he will seriously consider any input that does not coincide with his present policies and that the overriding purpose of the meeting is to use the presence of Chicano Leaders as an implied or expressed endorsement of his inhumane and injust foreign policy programs and immigration policies.

Thus for Mr. Carter has ignored input and concerns voiced by local, state and national Chicano and Latino community organizations and he continues to encourage the development and erection of social, political and economic barriers between Chicanos and other Latino entities.

In particular we are protesting Mr. Carter's insensitivity to the Chicano and Latino national and world communities by insisting on constructing the 10 foot concrete and steel fence along the border between Mexico and the United States.

If Mr. Carter is truly interested in developing policies which are just and responsive to the needs and realities of the Chicano and Latino communities we invite him to abandon the refuge of Washington and the White House walls and meet directly with the people to become fully aware of the impact of his proposed actions.

In that regard we invite President Carter to attend a rally of National Chicano leaders and local and state community groups at 12:00 noon on Sunday February 11, 1979 at Larson Park, San Ysidro, California to protest the construction of the infamous "Tortilla Curtain"!

the looking away, ignoring your problems by anyone, or the use of your people as scapegoats for problems in the economy of the U.S. The term scapegoat is a great role for minorities and you should plan on experiencing this as groups such as the KKK come up with simplistic solutions to the problems of the society in which we both live.

It seems to me you have expressed your feelings eloquently on behalf of your people, and certainly this can be a catalyst for group action. But I feel that you must come
