

## **Student art gallery newly named The Mandeville Annex**

The student art gallery at the University of California, San Diego has a new name, a new location and a fresh coat of paint this fall.

The Mandeville Annex is located in room B-118 of the Mandeville Center. It replaces The Other Gallery, which was located in the Humanities-Library Building on Revelle campus, and which served as the student gallery for several years.

The new location is an improvement because it places the student gallery in the university's visual and performing arts center, according to Valerie Colston, director of the gallery.

Undergraduate and graduate exhibits generally are shown for a week at a time. Gallery hours are noon to 5 p.m. Monday through Friday, and admission is free,

The gallery is operated and maintained by students, with funds acquired from the Associated Students and from print sales conducted by the gallery support group during the school year. Each artist is responsible for organizing and disassembling his or her own show, so students get first-hand experience which could be valuable later, Colston said.

Last year, The Other Gallery was the site of a few non-student exhibits. "Women at Work," an exhibition from the East Coast, was first shown on the West Coast in the student gallery. An exhibition of Chinese art and artifacts also was displayed in the gallery. Colston said she hopes to have similar special exhibits this year, though visual arts students have priority.
