

Two more professors join faculty in the humanities at UCSD

Two professors of philosophy have joined the growing list of faculty appointments in the humanities at the University of California's San Diego campus, Chancellor Herbert York said today.

They are Jason L. Saunders, 411 from the University of North Carolina, and Avrum Stroll, 42, from the University of British Columbia.

The appointments are effective July 1 of this year, York said.

The first four appointments to the humanities faculty-- professors of English, German, and philosophy-- were announced in late April.

UCSD expects to admit its first undergraduate students in the fall of 1964--juniors and seniors who plan to major in the sciences.

Dr. Saunders received an A. B. degree in 1947, and A. M. and Ph.D degrees from Columbia University.

He has taught at Columbia and Ripon College, and in the U. S. Army Educational Program. He was named to the faculty of the University of North Carolina in 1954., and appointed full professor of Philosophy in 1962. He is presently a visiting professor at the Claremont, California, Graduate School on leave from North Carolina.

Dr. Saunders' books include "Justus Lipsius: The Philosophy of Stoicism," published in 1955, and "The Philosophy of Early Stoicism," to be published this summer by The Bobbs-Merrill Company. He is the author of many scholarly articles and reviews, including 12 articles on ancient and Renaissance Stoic and Neoplatonic authors which will appear in the forthcoming "Encyclopedia of Philosophy.

He is a member of the American Philosophical Association, the Mediaeval Academy of America, the Society for Ancient Philosophy, and was a founding member of the Renaissance Society of America.

He was a Ford Foundation Post-Doctoral Fellow at Columbia in 1951-52, and was a Franklin J. Matchette Foundation Research Fellow in 1954. Since 1958, Dr. Saunders has directed the Honors Programs in Philosophy at the University of North Carolina.

Dr. Stroll received B.A., M.A. and Ph.D. degrees from the University of California, Berkeley, the latter in 1951. He has taught at the Berkeley campus, the University of Oregon, the University of Iowa, and has been at the University of British Columbia since 1952.

His books include "The Emotive Theory of Ethics," published in 1954 by the University of California Press, "Philosophy Made Simple" and "Introduction to Philosophy," both in collaboration with Prof. R. H. Popkin, and "Reason and Religious Belief." His articles and reviews have appeared in many scholarly journals.

Dr. Stroll was awarded a Koerner Foundation Grant in 1958, and a Nuffield Fellowship in 1961, and is a member of the American Philosophical Association, the American Oriental Society, the American Society of Aesthetics, the Mind Society, and the Aristotelian Society.
