

Open House to be held

April 25, 1985

Discover what's happening on the frontiers of research, climb Mt. Everest with a medical research team, learn about life in New Guinea, take in an art exhibition, or just relax and listen to an outdoor concert. This and much more welcomes you from noon to 5 p.m., Sunday, May 5, at the University of California, San Diego Open House.

"We hope everyone will take advantage of this opportunity to explore this exciting campus," said UCSD Chancellor Richard C. Atkinson. "This is an opportunity to bring your family to meet some of the faculty, students and staff who make UCSD such a fascinating place."

There will be lectures, university bookstore events and a book sale, a 2:15 p.m. tour of the Mandell Weiss Center for the Performing Arts, live music, art exhibitions, a Renaissance Faire, College Bowl finals, demonstrations of community safety, the anthropology department's presentation on New Guinea; health science exhibits by the UCSD Medical Center, shuttles to UCSD's Scripps Institution of Oceanography, a 10K unofficial run and breakfast, a fun run and a stroller run; and an afternoon of live entertainment, food and bake sales. A program of events, with their times and locations, will be available at the Open House.

Scheduled lectures include: "Student Life at UCSD," "Tough Questions on Global Conflict and Cooperation," "The American Medical Research Expedition to Mount Everest," by Dr. John West; "The Guilty Splendor: Spanish Culture and the Spanish Bullfight," "The Shape of Things to Come," "Urban Design in San Diego," "The FBI as Literary Critic: The File of Bertolt Brecht," and "Exploring the Universe from Space and From the Ground," by E. Margaret Burbidge, one of the world's foremost astronomers. Times and locations of lectures and other events will be listed in the Open House official program.

Along with lectures, there will be numerous information booths featuring Staff Personnel, student organizations, Summer Session, Early Outreach Program, Housing and Food Services, University Toastmasters, Career Services, an Upward Bound book sale and bake sale, General Clinical Research Center, Pharmacy, Respiratory Therapy, Hyperbaric Medicine Center, Organ and Tissue Acquisition Center, Radiation Oncology, San Diego Regional Poison Center, Infant Special Care Center, Seniors Only Comprehensive Assessment and Retirement Evaluation (SOCARE), Teacher Education Program (TEP), Pathology display, Neurosciences (rhythms and brain waves), Hand Rehab Center, Burn Center, Student Financial Services, Alumni Relations, Communicative Disorders Center, Menopause Clinic, and much more.

Live music will be offered the entire afternoon, beginning at 11 a.m. with TKO playing soft rock on the gym steps, followed by the UCSD Concert Choir, the Community Choir, Los Alecranes Mojados, the Wind Ensemble, folk music by Sam Hinton; the UCSD Jazz Ensemble, the Gospel Choir and Mariachis "Cachanilla." At 3 p.m., pianist Cecil Lytle will give a piano recital called "The Naked Scriabin," in the Mandeville Auditorium.

Sign up for the 10K run at 7:30 a.m. at Muir Field. There will be a \$3 registration fee which includes a hot breakfast at 10 a.m. in the Muir North Dining Room. There will be a stroller run and a children's run beginning at 7:30 a.m. at Muir Field.
