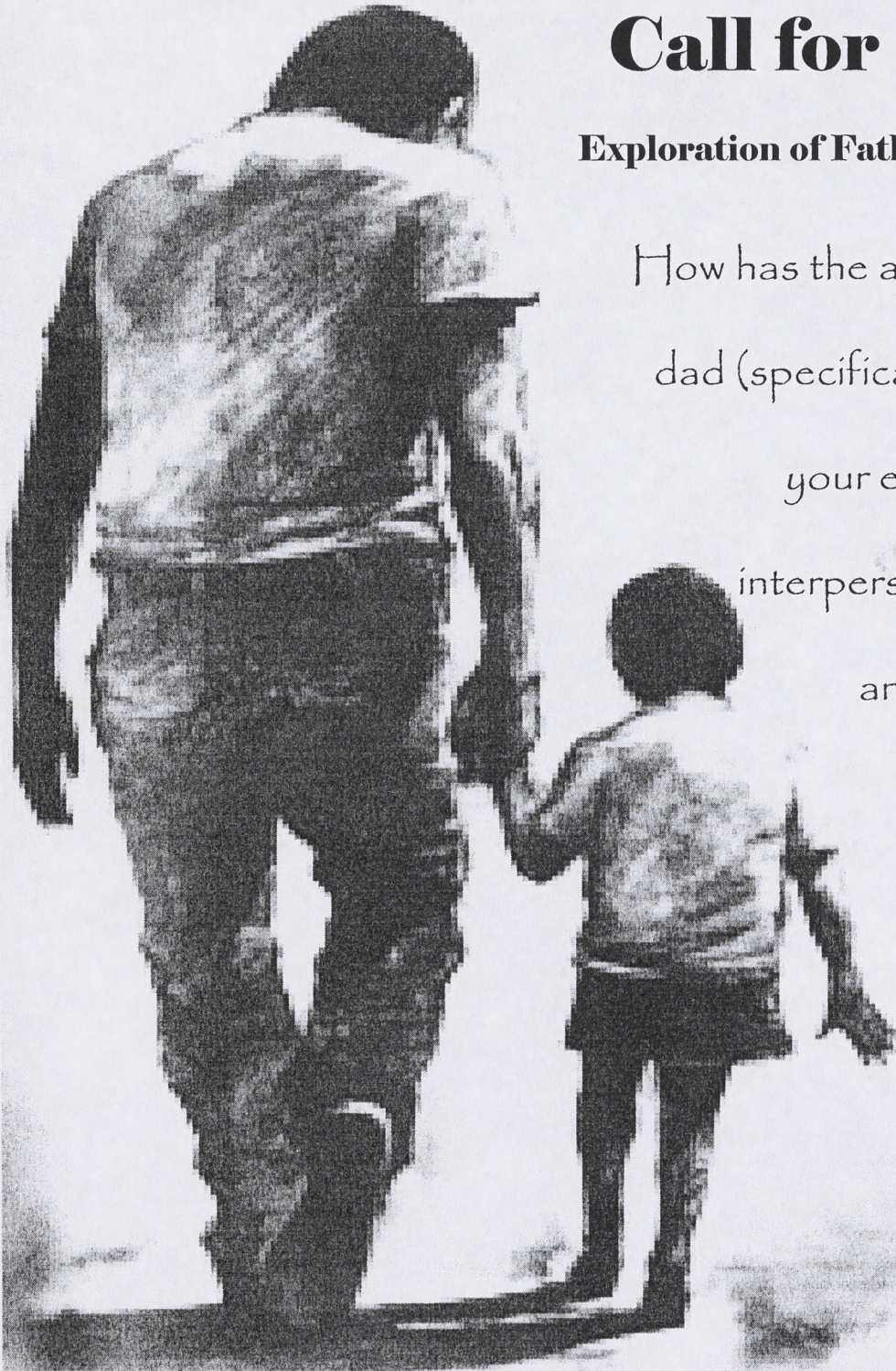

Exploration of Father- Daughter Relationships

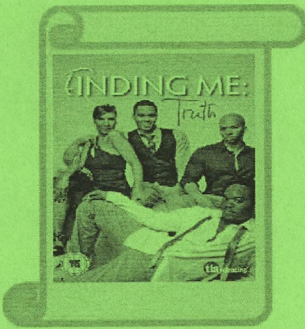
How has the absence or presence of a dad (specifically biological) affected your emotional health, interpersonal relationships, and sexuality?

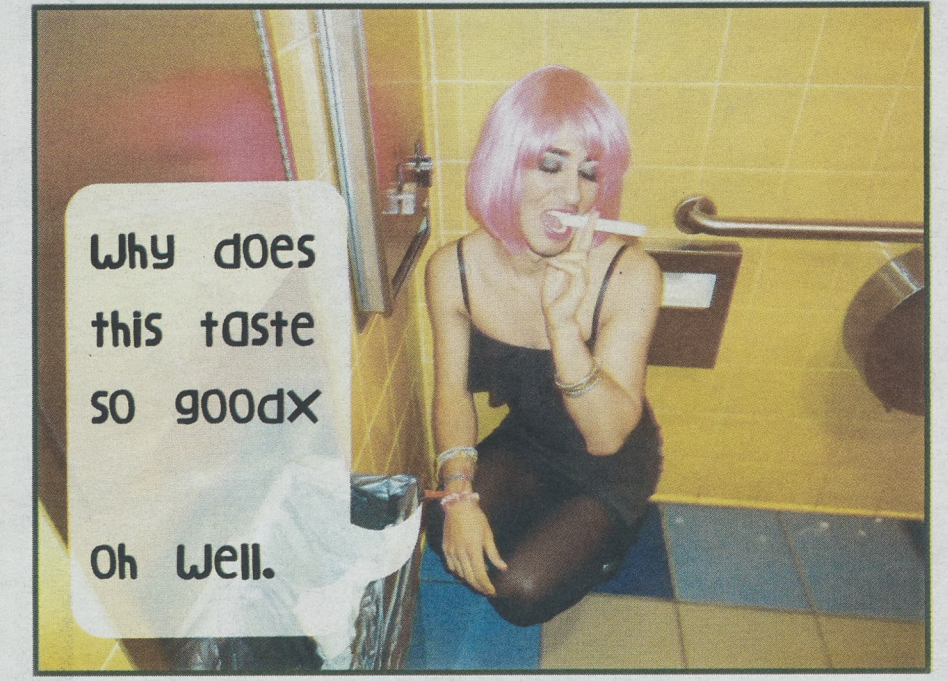
