Remembering Angela August


From Shaun Travers, Director of UC San Diego's LGBT Resource Center

She was a Human Development major and Visual Arts/Studio minor while studying at UC San Diego. When first displayed in 2011, Angela indicated that inspiration for this piece relied heavily upon impressionists of the past as well as contemporary abstract works. Most recently, Angela was seeking to explore women's rights, gay rights, as well as gender differences in the United States. She hoped one day there would be greater acceptance and acknowledgement for lesbian relationships.

Under the direction and supervision of the TRiO full time staff, tutors are responsible for providing weekly tutoring to a consistent caseload of about 10-20 students for each school site, with a maximum of 2 school sites assigned per year. Tutors conduct individual and small group tutoring, depending on students' coursework such as but not limited to math, science, writing, history, etc. Monitor student progress in academic and non-academic areas. Document student's participation and their progress in tutorial sessions. Provide student advisement as needed. Refer students to project staff for counseling needs. Utilize educational tutorials and individual learning plans. Assist in compiling and preparing educational materials for use in tutorial sessions and classroom assignments. Maintain ongoing relationship with project staff to inform them of individual issues and needs of project participants. Provide supervision of students at all motivational and academic enrichment activities, including campus tours, cultural events, Saturday activities, etc.

(Please note: this pamphlet does not contain all resources available in the local San Diego


Area. This guide seeks to serve as a starting place, with hopes that future students, faculty and staff can make edits to support future QPOC at UCSD)



-TIA: Transgender Intersex Alliance The mission of the Transgender Intersex Alliance is to provide a safe space for individuals undergoing SRS (sexual-reassignment or hormone therapies), as well as identities that may include, but are not limited to: genderqueer, genderfluid, genderless, gender non-conforming, agender, bigender, neutrois, androgyne, gender-bender, gender-blender, gender-f*cker, other gendered, two-spirit, genderneutral, trans, intersex, or folks who don't quite fit into a binary identity. It is also a space to promote solidarity and education between members and allies of the transgender community. The first half of the meeting is a closed space for the aforementioned list of identities, and during the second portion, allies are welcome to join in on the conversation and activities. Count on a safe, confidential space that provides insight and information, coupled with fun and off-campus outings. Hope to see





San Diego's Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual, Transgender Jewish Community

The mission of J*Pride is to reach out to the Jewish lesbian, gay, bisexual, and transgender community, encourage LGBT individuality and Jewish identity, and create opportunities for interconnections of the LGBT community. J*Pride seeks to foster inclusion of the Jewish LGBT community within the larger Jewish community of San Diego.

Though only a few years old, J‡Pride is expanding rapidly in both membership and visibility.

J⇔Pride caters to Jews of any denomination who identify as lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender, intersex, queer, questioning, or ally.

Programming by J‡Pride consists of events that bring Jewish and LGBT issues together in interesting and provocative ways. Examples of past events include the screening of *Yossi & Jagger*, about a same-sex relationship in the Israeli army at the 2004 San Diego Jewish Film Festival, a lecture and book signing by Rabbi Steven Greenberg, the first openly gay Orthodox Rabbi, a J‡Pride Seder featuring a Haggadah (prayer book) specifically focused on LGBT issues, and frequent Shabbat services and dinners at local synagogues.

In addition to these events, J‡Pride members have attended community-wide events such as The Center's Annual Gala, San Diego AIDS Walk and the San Diego Pride Parade and Festival.

J⇔Pride is a program of the Lawrence Family Jewish Community Center (JCC), Jacobs Family Campus, and has representation on its executive committee from The Center in Hillcrest, Jewish Family Service, the United Jewish Federation (UJF), and the San Diego Rabbinical Association.


