 - REGISTERED CONTESTANTS WILL HAVE A SINGLE OPPORTUNITY TO PERFORM; NO EXCEPTIONS.



Dr. Ekaette (Philo) Mbong Research Scientist and Science Advocate



Dr. Ekaette "Philo" Mbong left her hometown of Norman, Oklahoma to attend the University of Alabama at Birmingham on a Women's Varsity Soccer Scholarship. For her undergraduate research, she studied sex determination of sea turtle hatchlings and graduated with her B.S. in Biology. She received her M.S. and Ph.D. in Biological Sciences from the University of Alabama after elucidating the interplay of viral proteins in herpes infections. Currently, she is a postdoctoral fellow at UCSD studying the effects of obesity on reproductive health.

As an African American, Dr. Mbong is keenly aware of the lack of diversity among scientists. Therefore, she has used her fellowships from the National Science Foundation and the American Society for Microbiology as launch pad for increasing equality, diversity and science awareness in her community. She is currently pursing science policy avenues in Washington, D.C. that will allow her to continue her passion of increasing the awareness of the importance of higher education in science, technology, engineering, and mathematics (STEM) in the United States.

Andrea Smith is an Associate Professor in the Media and Cultural Studies Department at UC Riverside. After receiving her Ph.D. in History of Consciousness at UC Santa Cruz in 2002, she taught at the Program in American Culture at the University of Michigan. Her publications include: Native Americans and the Christian Right: The Gendered Politics of Unlikely Alliances and Conquest: Sexual Violence and American Indian Genocide. She is also the editor of The Revolution Will Not Be Funded: Beyond the Nonprofit Industrial Complex, and co-editor of The Color of Violence, The Incite! Anthology. Dr. Smith currently serves as the U.S. Coordinator for the Ecumenical Association of Third World Theologians, and she is a co-founder of "Incite! Women of **Color Against Violence.**"
