





Come meet noted Chicano professor Richard T. Rodriguez and listen to him lecture on his current research in the area of queer Latino studies.

Prof. Rodriguez most recently has been the chairman of the Latina/Latino Studies Program at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign. He has published widely on contemporary American literature with a focus on Latino studies, gender and sexuality, and film and visual cultures. His book, Next of Kin: The Family in Chicano/a Cultural Politics (2009), has had a major impact on the field of sexuality studies and is used in graduate seminars across the nation. In 2011, the book won the prestigious National Association for Chicana & Chicano Studies award.



Prof. Rodriguez earned his B.A in English at University of California, Berkeley and a Ph.D in History of Consciousness at the University of California, Santa Cruz. Dr. Rodriguez is Associate Professor at the University of Illinois at Urbana-Champaign.


