

Prison Nation: Posters on the Prison Industrial Complex features powerful posters from artists, activists and organizations around the country and the world crying out against the devastating impact of the mass incarceration and the rapidly growing prison industrial complex (PIC). The U.S. has only 5% of the world's population yet we maintain 25% of the world's imprisoned population—the largest prison population in the world—over 2.3 million people behind bars—quadrupling between 2008 and 2011.

Prison Nation presents many of the critical issues surrounding the system of mass incarceration including: the death penalty, the Three Strikes law, racism, access to educa-tion and health care, the growing rate of incarceration, slave labor, divestment, privatiza-tion, torture, and re-entry into the community. (*Prison Nation*, a 75 piece exhibition, will be divided and on display at the two locations above.)




