Wild is here to perform with the La Jolla Civic-University Orchestra on Sunday, December 5. His appearance is one of many he has made all over the world beginning with the NBC Symphony and continuing with the Philadelphia, Cleveland, San Francisco, Montreal and London Symphony Orchestras.

He was the first American soloist to play George Gershwin's "Rhapsody in Blue" over NBC with Arturo Toscanini, the first to play Paul Creston's "Piano Concerto" in Paris and Washington, D.C. as well as the first to play Dmitri Shostakovich's "Piano Trio in E Minor."

Wild also has many varied recordings to his credit.
