

"Diversions and Delights," a one-man show starring Vincent Price

"Diversions and Delights," a one-man show starring Vincent Price, will be presented at 8 p.m. Thursday, May 14, in the Mandeville Center Auditorium at the University of California, San Diego.

Price portrays Oscar Wilde, the playwright, poet and wit who was exiled from England at the end of his career, He is delivering a lecture in an old concert hall in Paris, offering observations on a variety of topics with the same sharp, irreverent wit that brought him fame and led to his eventual censorship.

The imagined lecture by the writer of such popular plays as "The Importance of Being Earnest" and "Picture of Dorian Gray" was created by John Gay. Price, the star of the program is the veteran of radio, theater and more than 100 films, as well as a successful author.

Tickets to the performance cost \$8 and \$6.50, general admission, and \$6.50 and \$5 for students. Tickets are available at the UCSD Central Box Office, 452-4559.
