

Friends of UCSD Library to hold 6th annual book sale

The Friends of the UCSD Library will hold its sixth annual book sale from 10 a.m. to 5 p.m. Saturday, May 13, at the entranceway to the Central University Library on the University of California, San Diego campus.

The sale is open to the general public. Books for the sale, which benefits the UC San Diego libraries, come from a variety of sources, according to Alvina A. Robertson of the library's administrative staff. Many are donated by members of the community or members of the Friends to the libraries specifically for the sale. Many of the items to be sold are parts of large donated collections that contained books already owned by the libraries.

Among the offerings this year are books on almost every topic imaginable, with works on literature, history and psychology especially well-represented. There will also be a large collection of books in French, Spanish, German and Russian, in addition to a number of scarce, old and rare books.

All books will be put out for selection within the first three hours of this year's one-day sale.
