

Clark Kerr, Carneige Council on Policy Studies in Higher Education chairman, to speak at UC Alumni Club meeting

Clark Kerr, chairman of the Carneige Council on Policy Studies in Higher Education, will speak Wednesday, Oct. 9, at a dinner meeting of the UC Alumni Club of San Diego County.

Kerr, president emeritus of the University of California, will discuss the "Uncertain Future of Higher Education", at 8 p.m. in the Versailles Room of the Little America Westgate Hotel.

At the dinner, Kerr will be presented the Founders Award of the local organization "in recognition and appreciation of his efforts in obtaining a campus of the University of California for San Diego." Kerr was UC president in the 1950s when efforts were begun to establish UCSD.

Recognition will also be given to members of the 1955 San Diego Chamber of Commerce committee who helped UC officials develop a new campus in San Diego.

In addition, an Alumni Recognition Award will be presented to Ivor de Kirby of San Diego by Collette Seiple, executive director of the University of California Alumni Association, for his long-time efforts on behalf of the association.
