

Dear Son,

The Longe wished for Packets is at last arrived, which
Brings me your welcome letters and the Post just going
have hardly time to acknowledge the receipt of them
The fears & anxiety I have bin in for all your safety, can't
be express But thanks to our Great God that has
Preserved you all through the Dreadfull Jns caused by
and all your Dear family safe arrival to England
where I hope to see you to enjoy all the Pleasure and
Satisfaction you desire I thank you my Dear Son for
being so particular in the account of things all your
occurrences w^t gives me great Pleasure and more
Especially when you tell me that you were all well
and that you are reconciled to the Client I hope the
Court won't be troublesome to you I am glad you
have placed my Dear Girl & Tijs at School and don't
w^t but they will be pleased with their situation and
endeavour to fetch up there fort time the greater plea-
sure I can have now will be to see you and your
Dear Family often and hope my Dear Son you will
make my Daughter happy in the Payment she is in, and
desire you Providence in conducting your affairs with
~~the~~ ^{all} particular economy that you may share the fate of
many of our Countryfolks — the last year has bin very
dry especially at Gowrie and their has bin great Short-
age of Provisions at Gowrie particularly bread upon land
since very valuable slaves on both Estates Mr Fin-
lister has with his Brother purchased a sugar work
at P^r Gowrie and as I hear spread most of this time at it
I seldom see her from any of Estates but since my
death two days ago who told me they believed you would
make two hundred & thousand at Gowrie, all our friends here
are over & deare kindly to be remembered to you
particularly Mr & Mrs William & Mrs Fletcher whose =

Huband is gone away for Deptt it is said gone to England
to his uncle you mention Mrs Caulfield Disposing of
the Lands in this Parish and am very glad the Sale is
not good for the Man that went over to Purchase it was
Determined to take an advantage of the not knowing the Va-
lue of the Soil, as soon as I can see Wallace the Surveyor
will endeavor to get what, & Devotions of the Land
as was among the three Sisters Mrs Mahagen sold first
and left no Children so that two Shares of the sole must
belonge to Mrs Caulfield I think it was fifty acres
in the ^{original} that belonged to the three Sisters, there was taken
some land about Barramy Estate where John
formerly had a Den, and as here Mahagen sold
believe the other Sister did not sell hers she has
bought the Bay over out that Ole has Bought
wright in Westmoreland I think it great
be cheated out of all the wright for such a small
I wish you would purchase the Swan land as
it joins on Mollie's Hall now it is cleared &
fenced in it looks ^{very well} and I just agreed to let Mrs
Hutall have it, could have filled it out at a great
rent it looks quite light some many People
askt to rent it we have now got the Courts of As-
sises or Orissa & Leominster they have bin sitting there
two Days and has brought a great Concouse of
People to Leominster and such a hullay and
Confusion about me, that I cant be able to write
to my Daugther and beg she will excuse me
till the next opportunity and except of my true
Blessing and all that ^{best} Ole your self & my Dear
G.^d Children not forgetting Mrs Humphrys -
