## INTK CDUCTION.

The Census Patrol was begun by Mr. Horem priur to his proceeding on leave at the ond of January, and was complated by the writer. The completion was delayed by recalls to LOI ENGAU and BALUAN for preparations and reception of the United Nations yisiting ission in March, and the District Commisitioner' Tour in February, and was further delayed by the shc rtage or workboa's needed to visit the Mastern isiands of the Jensus Division.

The Council Tax Collection which was begun by Ka. Horam ha* since bcen completed, $w^{4}$ 动 the excention of Council villages on the Nortil Coast, by the Council Tfx Committee.

The number of births recorded by the patrol is approximutely the same as lor last year, while the number of Ciaths is considerably lower, 109 for 1958 as against 161 for 1957. However the excess of migrations out over nigrations in gives a nett increase of only fifty-five in the population of the Census Division.

BUNKLNAU village, on BALUAN Island, has now ceased to exist, as its inhabitants have all neturned to their original villages. The remaining residents of FAFAI on PAK Isiend, five in number, have migrated to TANDUAL to enable them to Join the Council.

## NATIVE SITUATION.

Many minor disputes were brought to the noti.ce of the patrol, deaing almost exclusively with marital troables, and non-repayment of debts, some of which were incurres some Jeavs ago. Most of these were settled ont of court, but there is need of a patrol by a Magistrate of the Court for Native Affairs. in the METAWARI area to settle outstanding matters, and to mediate in a land dispute of long standing.

Considerable bad-feeling still exists between the follow\&re if the KIPEL Cult at KAMBUTYO and the followars of the PALIAU Cult. Whilst at RAMBUTYO, the patrol was approeched by seven menbers of LEINKM village who were surrently living at PENCHAL, claiming that ther had bean ordered to leave their village by KIPK as their prescence ram was delaying the arrival of the exlected "cargo", and thath they complied with his order since in 1946 a native's throat was cut at RAMBUTYO for non-conformist activities.

KIPGI, cross-claimed that these men ( $w$ ho still support PALIAU ) were ordered by the latter to leave LENKAU, so as to discreait him with the Administration. This charge could not be substantiated. KIPEL and various witnesses accompanied the patrol to BALUAN, whery a preliminary investigation was carrie?
out. The matter was then referred to LOF NGAU for adjudication by a senior officer.

Elsewhere, the native situarion is quiet, and the patrol was wel. received at all places visited.

Some small vililages in the inl.gnत gentson of the Census Djvision c.e. Sin, busabon, Gwu rimirnit have oniy rive or six ablebodied men resiakent in their villages, and claim undue hardship it carrying out cominal village works. These villages have some fev young men working within the District, while their families remsin at home. It would be appreciated if you would advis if it is poesible to orderthese to return home for a certain time each year to provide adequate housing etc. for their dependents.

Inquiries made and received diring the patrol have been dealt with in separate correepondence.

VIIIAGE HOUS'NG.
Housing is generally satisfactory through-out the area, but sery few viilages have s sufficient no. of latrines. Instructions ewre left, with village officials for this situation to be remedied.

## VIILAGE OFFICIALS.

With reference to the LENKAU disturbance as mentioned above, it is advised that the recently elected Councilior of LIENKAU, PUNAU, sanctioned the compulsory migration, and on another occasion permitted a man co order his daughter to leave her hustand until such time as the husband joined the KIPEL chuscin. PJNAU is a member of the sect, and it is
considered that he is unsuitable for the office of Councillor.

## CO-OPERATIVES

Stores were visited at MBUNAI, MBUXS, PAK and RAMBUTYO. Store trade appeared to be satisfactory, but copra purcheses at MBUNAT store wers smell.

RAMBUTVO store has certain items of normal ration issue it,ems for sale ot reduced prices, ut thoye is 5í1.12 no demand for them. It is believed shat the same situation exists in other stores, and it is suggested thatthe Administration could purchase these stocks for issue to employees at LORFNGAU.

Schools were visited at MBUNAT, LOAMAT, and DENCHAL.
There are thirteen children from NAUNA attending the Administration school at LOAMAT, some $4 \frac{1}{2}$ hours distant by workboat. As there are nine more children of school age at NAUNA, it is requested that consideration be given to placing a school on NAUNA itselir, thus obviatilig the necessity of long canoe voyages to and from this outlying island, and enabling the children to live with their parents.

MADICAL AND ERALITH.
The standard of health throughout the area patrolled is very good. However, there is no Aid Post on LOU Island, which has a population of 530 in its three vilalages. These

At several Aio posts visited, stocks of meúicines were low, due to the inability of the A.P.O to go to LOREICAU for
 cuin that 11 they do not arrive at LORENGAS before the seventh of each month they must walt till next month for their supplies. Since even under favourable conditions, a journes to LORENCAU and back misms for orderlies at PENCHAT, MBUKF, and PELIKAWA means an ubsence of a week ficm their lusts, would it be possible for the medicinal supnilies for these posts to be sent to BALFAN, and forwarded to them from there?

Whilst the patrol was at PAR, ann urgent message was recelveá from TONG Is. for assistance to be given to a woman who was dying, of what subsequently proved to be pneumnnia. ThePAK A.P.O. and The E.\&.W. medical orderly were both ab sent in LORENGAU at the time, and MR. SAXBY, of PAK Plantafion consented to accompany the patrol to TONG with his personal supply of medicines.

Mr. SAXBY treated the woman on arrival at TONG and again on wager return to PAK, and was very ir thumenteil in hir recovery.

It would be appreciated if the Adminfstration would send an acknowledgment to $\mathbb{M R}$. Saxby for his services.
