

Kate Millett, author of "Sexual Politics" to lecture

Kate Millett, whose treatise on "Sexual Politics" has been called "the Bible of the women's movement," will speak "On Being a Woman Writer" at 8:00 p.m. Friday, February 6 in the Muir College Cafeteria at the University of California, San Diego.

Her UC San Diego appearance, sponsored by the university's Women's Center, is free and open to the public.

Millett, an avant-garde artist, sculptress and filmmaker, was a doctoral candidate at Columbia University when her Ph.D. thesis, "Sexual Politics," catapulted her into overnight fame and controversy. The book has been translated into 22 languages, including Japanese, in which its author is fluent.

The book's Japanese edition featured a special introduction by Millett who is married to sculptor Fumio Yoshimura and who has spent two years in the Far East.

Millett's latest work - a sculpture show - opened recently at Greenwich Village's Noho Gallery to rave reviews. She spoke last in Texas at a benefit for Iranian political prisoners.
