

Lecture series on different concepts of healing practiced today

January 16, 1978

"Faces of Healing," an eight-part lecture series that will explore some of the different concepts of healing practiced today, including preventative medicine, will begin Tuesday, Jan. 17, at the University of California, San Diego.

The series, which is free and open to the public, will begin at noon each Tuesday through March 7 in the Third College Lecture Hall Building. The series, being presented for the second year, is designed to be of interest to both pre-med and medical students and the general public. It is sponsored by the UC San Diego Health Science Advisory Program, the Association for Medical Arts and the Department of Community Medicine in the UC San Diego School of Medicine.

The lectures will feature different speakers each week. The opening lecture on January 17 will feature Dr. Paul Brenner, who is in private practice in La Jolla and also serves as an assistant clinical professor of reproductive medicine in the School of Medicine. Brenner will talk on "Concepts of Health, Healing and Disease."

The second lecture, on January 24, will feature anthropologist Dr. Lola Ross speaking on "Love's Body/Death's Body - 'Primitive' Medicine/Modern Medicine." The January 31 lecture will present a panel discussion of the osteopath, the chiropractor and the M.D.

On February 7 Dr. Robert Kessel will talk on holistic medicine and on February 14 the subject will be "Tapping the Healing Source" featuring a parapsychologist. Dr. Doris Howell, Chairperson of the Department of Community Medicine, will talk on "Our Health System Past and Present -Can We Handle the Future?" on February 21.

A three-member panel featuring Dr. Paul Saltman, vice chancellor for academic affairs, Dr. Howard Hunt, chairman of the Department of Physical Education and Harvey Selverston, student health science advisor, will talk on "Preventative Medicine: Nutrition, Exercise and Stress Reduction" on February 28.

The final lecture in the series on March 7 will be on the future aspects of medicine and its development with a speaker to be announced.
