Laura D'Andrea Tyson, national economic advisor to President Clinton, will visit the University of California, San Diego on June 15 to deliver the commencement address for the Graduate School of International Relations and Pacific Studies (IR/PS) graduation ceremony. The ceremony will take place at 11 a.m. in the IR/PS Robinson Building Plaza.

Prior to the graduation ceremony, Tyson will also participate in a breakfast roundtable from 8 to 9:30 a.m. in the Deutz Conference Room of the Institute of the Americas complex. The UCSD Economics Roundtable is being sponsored by IR/PS and the Department of Economics. The cost to attend the roundtable is \$50. Tyson, who was appointed in February 1995 as President Clinton's national economic adviser, is currently on leave from the University of California, Berkeley, where she is a professor of economics and business administration, and served as director of the Institute of International Studies and research director of the Berkeley Roundtable on the International Economy (BRIE). Since 1993 and prior to her appointment as national economic adviser, she served as chairman of the White House Council of Economic Advisers and as a member of the President's Cabinet and Domestic Policy Councils.
