

UCSD receives research and training grants totaling \$433,934

Research and training grants totalling \$433,934 were awarded to various departments of the University of California, San Diego, during the months of June and July.

Dr. Clifford Grobstein, Dean of the School of Medicine, received a grant of \$282,062 from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, Public Health Service, for a Program for Developmental Biology at UCSD.

The Department of Health, Education and Welfare, P.H.S., also awarded a grant of \$43,338 to Dr. Harold J. Simon, Department of Community Medicine, School of Medicine, for his study of "Pathogenesis of Staphylococcal Infection."

Dr. Gerhard N. Schrauzer, Department of Chemistry, received a grant of \$30,386 from the Department of Health, Education and Welfare, R.H.S., for his project, "Degradation of Pesticides With Vitamin B-12 and Metallop."

The National Science Foundation awarded a grant of \$30,300 to Dr. Hans E. Suess, Department of Chemistry, for his study of "Solar Related Secular Variations of the Atmospheric Carbon-14 Level."

A training grant of \$28,848 was awarded to Dr. Theodore H. Bullock the Department of Neurosciences.

The American Cancer Society awarded a grant of \$10,000 to Paul L. Price, Department of Biology, for his project, "Chemical Studies on the Structure and Function of Pancreatic Deoxyribonuclease."

Dr. Alfred B. Manaster, Department of Mathematics, received a grant Of \$9,000 from the National Science Foundation for research entitled "Recursive Function Theory."
