UCSD PROFESSOR'S VIDEO TO BE SHOWN AT WHITNEY BIENNIAL IN NYC

A videotape produced by DeeDee Halleck, a professor of communication at the University of California, San Diego, will be shown at the 1995 Biennial Exhibition at the Whitney Museum of American Art in New York City.

The film, "The Gringo in Mananaland," will be screened at the exhibition several times from May 17 through May 21.

Halleck, a film maker and media activist, is a leading advocate for alternative media in the United States. Her film and television productions have dealt with a variety of issues, including children and the media, and community art.

Her works have appeared in many film and video festivals in this country and abroad.

The Biennial Exhibition, on view at the Whitney Museum until June 4, will travel to Prague, Czech Republic, as one of the inaugural exhibitions of that country's new Museum of Modern Art.

The exhibition brings together the most significant developments in American art, film and video of the past two years.
