Gentlemen:

Mr. William Thum owns between 300 and 300 acres of land above the Lakeside bridge on the San Diego River and below the El Monte pumping plant with nearly a mile of riparian rights.

Mr. Hugo Thum used to have an interest in the property but some time ago passed away and Mr. William Thum is desirous of having the property deeded to the County as a public park.

I have suggested to him that the water rights be deeded jointly to the Lakeside Irrigation District and the La Mesa, Lemon Grove and Spring Valley Irrigation District, and that the land be deeded to the County.

The property at the present time is leased to an Italian. Of course, any deed to the County will be subject to this lease.

Some day it will make an ideal park for the City of Lakeside. It has some beautiful trees, a fine hill, an interesting cactus garden, and by acquiring a strip of land 200 or 300 feet wide, it can be made a part of the present Lakeside park.

I have aksed Mr. Thum to send down a blanket form of agreement transferring the water rights to the La Mesa and Lakeside Irrigation Districts, and will receive same this weak.

I am more than ever satisfied that some day the paramount suit will be decided adversely to the City and when so decided, these water rights will be invaluable.
