Four members of the University of California, San Diego Department of Drama faculty are scheduled to take part in the American Theatre Association (ATA) National Convention, August 10-15, in New York City.

Michael Addison, professor of drama and chairman of the department, will lead a panel discussion on "Approaches to Training Directors," and will present a paper titled "Directing Classical Theatre: Aeschylus' 'Oresteia' for a Contemporary Audience."

Associate Professor Mary Corrigan will present two papers at the convention. They are "An Approach to Theatre Training: The Need for More Mentors and Fewer Gurus" and "Pitfalls, Perils and Possibilities of Psychophysical Technique in Theatre Training."

Jorge Huerta, assistant professor of drama, will participate in a panel discussion on "Hispanic-American Theatre in the United States" and will also take part in the activities of the Multi-Cultural Affairs Committee of the ATA.

Luther James, lecturer, will present papers on "Blacks in the Media: Movies and Television" and "The View from Hollywood: 1965-1975."

The ATA is a professional organization of educators, scholars and theatre practitioners from high schools, colleges, universities and the commercial world.
