

Miss Eleanor Louise Stanton bequests \$10,000 for UCSD student loan fund.

A student loan fund of \$10,000 has been established at the University of California, San Diego, under the terms of the will of a San Diego woman, Chancellor Herbert York said today.

The money was left by Eleanor Louise Stanton, who died in 1961. She lived at 225 W. Walnut Street, San Diego. She graduated from the Berkeley campus of the University in 1905. Miss Stanton left portions of her estate to other local institutions, including San Diego State College and the Fine Arts Society.

At Miss Stanton's request, the loan fund at UCSD will be named in memory of her sister, Elizabeth Schuyler Stanton.

The bequest is UCSD's first large one for a student loan fund. It will supplement a smaller amount granted by The Regents last year, says Ted Forbes, Dean of Student Affairs, UCSD.

"Many of our best students would be unable to finish their graduate work without loans," Forbes says. "Loan funds such as this one set up by the Stanton bequest enable them to keep going until they get the higher degrees that will qualify them for responsible positions."
