

Dr. Lockwood appointed director of hospitals and clinics

Dr. Richard A. Lockwood has been appointed director of hospitals and clinics for the University of California, San Diego, Robert H. Biron, vice chancellor-business and finance, announced today.

In this newly created position, Dr. Lockwood will report to the vice chancellor and will be responsible for the fiscal and administrative management of the County-University Hospital and associated clinics. He will also handle planning, development, and subsequent administration for the campus teaching hospital, Biron said.

Dr. A. F. Crumley, administrator of the County-University Hospital will report to Dr. Lockwood. Harold L. Gano will be assistant director of hospitals and clinics.

Dr. Lockwood was trained as a surgeon and, until 1963, practiced surgery in Los Angeles and served at UCLA as an assistant clinical professor of surgery. Two years later he became a consultant to the medical education study at the University of Hawaii where he helped plan the two-year biomedical program.

He was born in Los Angeles and attended Harvard University as an undergraduate. Dr. Lockwood received his medical degree from Johns Hopkins University School of Medicine in 1947 and served as an intern in pathology at the Strong Memorial Hospital at the University of Rochester. He later interned in surgery at Johns Hopkins Hospital and served as a resident in surgery at the Wadsworth Veterans Administration Hospital in Los Angeles.

Following military service, he returned to Wadsworth in 1953 as a resident in proctology. He began his private practice in 1955. Dr. Lockwood joined UCSD in July 1965, to coordinate the program planning for the clinical science building and campus hospital and the County-University Hospital.
