My dear Colonel Fletcher:

On May 15th I mailed to Mrs. Ada L. Critchett, Clerk of the Banner School District the forms for calling a district meeting of the electorate of the Banner District. The purpose of the meeting is to consider a change of location of the school. It appears to be the wish of the people to change from the present location at the Wilcox farm to some place in the Cuyamaca end of the district. It is my understanding that this proposition is being discussed with your office especially the points as to the housing of the school.

If the board of trustees of the Banner District can show the Board of Supervisors that there will be resident during the school year eight children in the Banner District, the school will be continued and the State and County Aid will be available to finance the salary of the teacher.

If there is any further information needed, I shall be glad to furnish same.
