

Dr. Adolf W. Lohmann is PILS lecturer

Dr. Adolf W. Lohmann, professor of Applied Electrophysics at the University of California, San Diego, will be the third lecturer for the winter quarter in the Professors' Inaugural Lecture Series at 4:15 p.m., Thursday, January 23, in the Humanities-Library Auditorium, Revelle College campus.

The topic of Dr. Lohmann's lecture will be "Ernst Abbe, Scientist, Inventor and Social Reformer."

Dr. Lohmann, who was born in Germany, was appointed as professor at UCSD in 1968. He had served as a senior lecturer at the San Diego campus for a year before his appointment.

Dr. Lohmann received his B.Sc., M.Sc. and Ph.D. degrees in physics at the University of Hamburg. He has served as assistant professor and associate professor at the Physical Institute in the Technische Hochschule in Braunschweig, Germany, as a guest researcher at the Institute of Optics at the Royal Institute of Technology in Stockholm, Sweden, and as a consultant for the IBM Development Laboratory in San Jose.

He was appointed a National Travelling Lecturer of the Optical Society of America for 1967-68 and lectured to each of the 14 sections of the Optical Society of America throughout the United States.

Dr. Lohmann is a member of the German Physical Society, the German Optical Society, the German Photographers Society and the Optical Society of America. He has written more than 60 papers concerning his research in optics, particularly in holography.

The lecture will be free and open to the public.
