

Dr. Menard lecture "Mountains Under the Sea"

Dr. Henry W. Menard, Jr., Professor of Geology at the University of California's Scripps Institution of oceanography, will speak on "Mountains Under the Sea" in La Jolla, Wednesday, May 20.

The lecture will be given in Sherwood Hall, La Jolla, at 8:00 p.m. The public is invited. No seats will be reserved. Admission is free. The talk is sponsored by UCSD's Committee for Arts and Lectures.

Dr. Menard's chief field of study is the floor of the deep sea, particularly that of the Pacific Ocean. He has published numerous scientific papers on the subject. He has participated in several of Scripps' long expeditions.

A native of California, Dr. Menard received his Bachelor's and Master of Science degrees from California Institute of Technology, Pasadena, his Doctor of Philosophy degree from Harvard. He has taught at Cal Tech and at Harvard. He joined the staff of the U. S. Navy Electronics Laboratory in 1949 and left there in 1955 to come to Scripps.
