

UC SunDay, arts and music

Art exhibits, music, drama presentations and dance will liven up the festivities at UC SunDay, the community open house at the University of California, San Diego, scheduled from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. Sunday, April 29.

Visitors viewing the many displays on Revelle campus can take time out to listen to the UCSD Jazz Ensemble, directed by James Cheatham, from noon to 1 p.m. on the Revelle Plaza. From 1:30-2:30 p.m., the UCSD African Drummers and Dancers will present their exciting program on the lawn near the plaza.

From 11 a.m. to 2 p.m., the student recreation clubs will have their annual Spring Carnival on the steps of the Main Gymnasium. From noon to 1:30 p.m., demonstrations of disco, ballroom and folk dancing; juggling; gymnastics, and karate are scheduled. Spectators can also take in the thumb-wrestling contest, game booths, table tennis and an "un-olympics" featuring such sports as the egg toss.

A live jazz band will play from 2-4 p.m. at the Student Center east of the gymnasium, and students will hand out information on student organizations and activities at the center.

The Mandeville Art Gallery in the Mandeville Center currently is featuring the work of Betye Saar, an artist who was the subject of a recent public television documentary. The gallery will be open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m., and the artist will attend a reception at the gallery from 1-3 p.m. The documentary will be available for viewing at the gallery.

An undergraduate art exhibition will be on display at the Other Gallery in room 1200 of the Humanities-Library Building on Revelle campus, and the works of graduate students in the Department of Visual Arts will be shown in the East Room of the Mandeville Center.

An art exhibit will be open in room 2 of the University Extension complex north of Muir campus on North Torrey Pines Road. Refreshments will be served in the afternoon and the Extension registration and information office will be open from 11 a.m. to 4 p.m. University Extension also will have a booth on the lawn north of Urey Hall.

The Craft Center will be open during the day and crafts will be on display, with some pieces for sale. Demonstrations of techniques used in ceramics will be conducted throughout the day.

Visitors can watch the evolution of a major drama production at the open rehearsal of "Orestes, Orestes." Members of the UC San Diego Department of Drama will rehearse their upcoming play from 11 a.m. to 1 p.m. and from 2-4 p.m. on the plaza of the Central University Library.

The Center for Music Experiment, which provides innovative equipment and the freedom to experiment to composers of modern music, will be open from noon to 3 p.m. The facility is located in Building 408 on Warren campus.

These are just some of the activities scheduled for UC SunDay. Science exhibits, sports, tours, information booths and a variety of displays and demonstrations are planned. Food will be sold and helium-filled balloons will be given away.

Ample free parking is available in the Reville and Muir campus parking lots. To reach the campus, take Gilman Drive, La Jolla Village Drive or Genesee Avenue west from Interstate 5 or Torrey Pines Road north from La Jolla.
