Cologne Monday Evening July 21st 1834.

My dear Madam, Having arrived to sea here & not starting
 by tomorrow morning. I shall give you an account
 of our proceedings. I did not intend to write till we
 had left Frankfurt & had desired Mr. S. to inform
 you of our progress, but recollecting that they are also on
 their travel, you perhaps may have no communication
 with them. I gave Mr. S. a letter to send you the day
 before we left. On the Saturday morning we cleared about
 2 & arrived at Rotterdam within the 24 hours, we had
 a very calm passage & I slept through & without trouble
 & ease. We were very close packed in the ladies cabin
 & shared with children. On Tuesday we drove to
 the Hague Canal & having secured the stern cabin in
 Delf where we changed our boat, and arrived at Hague
 about 3 o'clock. Having heard so much about the
 beauties of the Dikes & Canals & I was astonished
 & delighted with the scenery, the number of pretty villages
 & beautifully kept country houses & gardens exceeded my
 ideas & had by the width of the Dike.

That evening we saw the town & drove to a village near
the sea, where the fishermen & women are famous for
their love of their ancient custom - On the 15 we were again
in a barge at 10-00 mt. busy in time to secure the cabin
we had about 14 people with us for some time. The Barges
were as interesting as the day before. At Leyden we had an
early dinner & saw the museum - It had the best collection
of skeletons & stuffed animals I ever saw; the former
are very curious. We hired a Carriage here for Haarlem
as the road is said to be much prettier than the canal.

On the 16. from 9. to 10 we enjoyed the Organ & as there
were two other parties to join us the expense was trifling,
I found the whole I was paid - For our Church music
I did not like it here so well as York, which also exceeds
it in power; but the different stops were both beautiful
& wonderful - the piece imitated an orchestra & we could
hear the bows of the violins drawn down. In another
the drums & trumpets of a military band. After that
a Thunder Storm, & several other pieces and concluded
with my Aunt's own favorite Hallelujah Chorus.

A Britanic after that took us to Amsterdam; I am
as Mr. Gubrows had been spoiled by the other Dutch boats
& thought this a very dirty place; but though not to compare
with the others, it would appear very neat & clean after a long
stay in the Continent; from the Palace we had a fine view of the whole city

and surrounding country, with the Spinder & Sea of Helder
We left in the afternoon of 17 by Harze & reached ~~Wierden~~
about 8. The house was often very pretty & handsome & called
The Hat was tremendous, as the Inn being full of ~~strangers~~ where
we arrived at Harze we got a bad & stuffy room. We
came by Britanic & were several hours later than we expected
owing to one of the horses being ill & we spent a couple of hours
at a village Inn disputing about a fresh horse. On the
19th we were on board the Steamer at five & it was here
I am when we reached Helder where we halted; then we
staid till 3 o'clock the day following Sunday 20. We then
got on board Steamer & landed again about 11. having run
beside a small place called ~~Wierden~~ on our right bank.
From there we came yesterday by Britanic to Cologne,
which seems a good dirty place. The Imperial was full
as we came to the Hotel de Princesse, which is tolerably good,
- we occupied certain inhabitants in the bed. When I must
get Cash we said today Tues. 22. after visiting the Church
shall post to either Bonn or ~~Wierden~~ & shall
proceed by Steam tomorrow to Coblenz or ~~Wierden~~ but then
I hope certainly to reach Frankfort by Saturday, as
our stock of supplies will be exhausted by that time.
We have had very fine weather hitherto but yesterday &
today being the clouds of day seem light, in Holland they were
in places only getting the first drop. In the space there is a
lack of Cash. I was employed with ~~Wierden~~ at the quantity of ~~Wierden~~
