

Public invited to meet the Chancellor's Search Committee

All members of the San Diego community have been invited to meet with the Chancellor's Search Committee when that group convenes at the University of California, San Diego November 12 and 13.

The 15-member committee, formed in October, is charged with screening candidates for the position of UC San Diego chancellor to replace Dr. William McElroy who has announced his resignation effective July 1, 1980.

The committee will meet informally with faculty leaders, graduate and undergraduate students, staff personnel and alumni members during the day-and-a-half visit. In addition, they will take part in a community drop-in coffee hour from 4:45 to 6 p.m. in Conference Room 111A in the Chancellor's Complex.

All persons who wish to express their personal viewpoints as to the role of the chancellor and the criteria and qualifications they feel are necessary in filling the position are invited to attend. Ample free parking will be available in the vicinity of the conference room.

According to UC President David Saxon, chairman of the committee, the committee welcomes recommendations, nominations and applications from all sources. The purpose of the current visit to UC San Diego, he said, is to gain a perspective of the campus rather than to discuss individual candidates.
