

Crafts classes offered at UCSD

Crafts classes in ceramics, photography, stained glass, woodworking and mime are being offered by the University of California Center for the Contemporary Crafts during the fall quarter at UC San Diego.

Classes are scheduled throughout the day Monday through Friday and facilities are open to participants for extracurricular use seven days a week, from 12 to 14 hours a day for maximum convenience. Personal development with individual attention from professional instructors is emphasized in an active studio classroom situation.

"One of the things that makes the center unique is our enrollment," says John Annaloro, director of the center. "UCSD students, faculty and staff, along with local community members, work together, learning and discovering the creative 'self' side-by-side."

Registration for the crafts classes is being held September 26-30 at the Crafts Center Building, located between the Student Center and the Gym on the UC San Diego campus. Individuals must register in person between 10 a.m. and 7 p.m. Monday and Tuesday or between 10 a.m. and 4:30 p.m. Wednesday through Friday. Instruction begins October 1 and all courses run nine weeks.

The combined studio and materials fee is \$50 which covers the costs of tools, equipment and some of the work materials used in classes. The fee is \$25 for enrolled UC San Diego students. There is no university credit given for the classes.
