In the Name of God Amen I Patience Hall of the Parish of St James and Island of Jamaica aforesaid  
 Widow being Sick of Body but of Sound Mind and Memory have thought fit to make and Ordain this my Last Will and Testament  
 in Manner and form following FIRST and principally I recommend my Soul to God who gave it hoping through his Merits and the  
 Merits of my Blessed Saviour to Inherit Eternal Life after this my Body I commit to the Earth to be therein Decently Interred at the  
 Discretion of my Executors hereafter Named  
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Son William Hall Five Pounds to buy him a Ring  
 I Give and Bequeath unto my Daughter in Law Mary Hall One Negroe Boy named Calo which I purchased of John Miller  
 I Give Devise and Bequeath all the rest Residue and Remainder of my Estate of what Kind Quality or Denomination that  
 soever to my Grandson Thomas Hall and his Heirs for Ever but in Case he should Die before he arrives to the Age of Twenty One Years  
 without Issue of his Body lawfully Begotten Then I Give Devise and Bequeath the same to my loving Son William Hall and Mary his  
 Wife and the Survivor of them and their Heirs for Ever  
 Lastly I do hereby Nominate constitute and appoint my Friends Hugh Christophers George Nichols and George Good in all of the  
 Parish of Westminster Esq<sup>rs</sup> to be my Executors of this my Last Will and Testament hereby Revoking and Disannulling all former  
 Will or Wills by me heretofore made In Witness whereof I have hereunto set my Hand and Seal this Thirtieth day of March One  
 Thousand seven hundred and Forty one
