UCSD TO HOST PREMIER ELIZABETH RUSSELL LECTURE

Richard Armstrong, curator of contemporary art at The Carnegie Museum of Art, Pittsburgh, PA, will deliver the premier lecture of the Elizabeth Russell Lecture Series, titled, HIM tour d'horizon: Curating the 1995 Carnegie International," to be held at 8 p.m. Wednesday, April 19, in the Robinson Auditorium at the UCSD Graduate School for International Relations and Pacific Studies. The lecture is free and open to the public.

The lecture will include a presentation of slides taken during Armstrong's international search for artists in preparation for the 1995 Carnegie International Exhibition.

In the course of two years of travel on five continents viewing art in studios, galleries and museums, Armstrong assembled an exhibition of artists' work, based on his analyses, that will open at The Carnegie Museum of Art in November, 1995.
