

Safer Sex

The Safer Sex Program - Playing it Safer is offered by the Peer Counselors in Sexuality and gives information on safer sex options. This includes proper usage of barriers, alternatives to sex, ways to discuss sex with a partner, and defines what safer sex really is. The audience is encouraged to participate by means of a "risky" to "less risky" continuum game. In addition, condom demonstrations are done on realistic, plastic models and scenarios are incorporated to help get the Safer Sex message across. Finally, the Peer Counselors are available for a question and answer session regarding sex/sexuality in general. Free condoms for those who attend.

The Hermaphrodite Revolution: Why is Intersex a Queer Issue? EAST CONFERENCE Room

People who are intersexed are born with bodies that cannot be easily categorized into binary system of male or female and are "cursed" by modern medicine with non-consensual surgeries and hormone treatments. Over the past six years, intersexuals have started organizing to stop these mutilations. As intersexuals come out of the closet, we often find ourselves in the Queer community. How does the overlap of intersex and Queer effect both communities? Several members of the Intersex Society of North America discuss their experiences of being Queer among Queers.

Dear United Way & UCSD:

Until the local chapter of the United Way divorces itself completely from supporting the Boy Scouts, an organization that readily admits it discriminates against gay persons, I cannot in good conscience provide any funding to the United Way. The Boy Scouts and the United Way and UCSD's support of the United Way is in direct contradiction to UCSD's Principles of Community and non-discrimination policy. The fact that someone can designate that their funds not go to the Boy Scouts still denies the fact that institutional support is provided which directly supports this bigoted organization.

If you "don't get it" please take the time to consider if the Boy Scouts was an organization that fired employees who were either Latino/a or African American or were Christians, UCSD would divorce itself from involvement with the United Way immediately. The bottom line is that this organization is reaping the benefits of our institutional support while discriminating against a class of people on arbitrary grounds.

I recognize that the United Way does support many tremendously worthwhile organizations that benefit many persons, however that does not justify it s support of any racist, sexist, and in this case, a homophobic organization.




